

#### 56th & Thomas: Now, it's a go

Back in March, we told you how we thought a new 40-unit apartment development was coming to the northwest corner of 56th St. and Thomas Rd. It was denied by a hearing officer, and then overturned and granted on appeal. The roughly 2-acre site that's been vacant for the past decade will be developed by Hawkins Companies of Boise, Idaho. AONA and neighbors worked with the developer who heard our concerns and addressed some of them in an open manner. We'll let you know when construction is to begin.

#### **City Council District 6 election this year**

In 2022, several elections, including state and federal, will take place. There's also City Council races for districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 (who-do-we-appreciate...but I digress). Ours is District 6.

City Council members can be an important resource for neighbors and neighborhoods on many things, from the delivery of infrastructure services to positions on zoning and rezoning.

While AONA will not declare a preference due to its non-profit, 501(c)3 status, we will keep you updated about the elections including voter registration, the November general election and, if necessary, a March runoff in 2023.

#### 56th St. improvement project

For several years, AONA, in partnership with Arcadia Camelback Mountain N.A. (ACMNA), has been working with the City on a plan to improve traffic flow and safety on 56th St. from Thomas to Camelback. ## **Summer Safety Tips**

So you're going out of town this summer? Great. Just remember these tips to keep your home safe.

- Before you leave:
- Have good locks on all doors and windows, and USE THEM!
- Ask a neighbor to watch the house while you're away. Leave your vacation contact info with family or a neighbor so you can be reached in case of an emergency.
- **Never** leave your house keys hidden outside your home.
- Stop all deliveries, or arrange for a neighbor to pick up your mail, newspapers and packages.
- Arrange for someone to mow your lawn & maintain the yard to give the home a lived-in look.
- **Plug in timers** to turn lights and a radio or television on and off at appropriate times. This helps to disguise that you are away.
- If you have a landline, turn the bell or ringer on your telephone down low. If a burglar is around, he won't be alerted to your absence by a ringing phone.
- **Don't announce** your absence on voice mail or social media.
- Leave blinds, shades and curtains in a normal position. Don't close them unless that is what you do when you are home.
- Close and lock garage doors and windows. Ask a neighbor to occasionally park their car at your home as you normally would.
- Secure storage sheds, attic entrances and gates.
- Let your neighbors know to call the police for suspicious activity. They should call 9-1-1 and let the officers check it out.

## He May Be the Richest Man in Arcadia

If wealth is measured in selfless acts, good deeds and friendships, our buddy Paul Barnes is surely a very wealthy man. Just consider Paul's resume, and you'll see what we mean. He was a founding member of Arcadia Camelback Mountain Neighborhood Association. He served on the Camelback East Village Planning Committee and was elected its Chairman.

One of his lasting legacies was helping to write the Arcadia Camelback Special Planning District overlay, which helps maintain the residential character within ACMNA's boundaries.

When Arcadia Osborn Neighborhood Association was forming in 1997, Paul served as a resource for neighbors in helping to grow our fledgling organization. In 2012, he was named Arizona Citizen Planner of the Year by the state chapter of the American Planning Association.





Paul Barnes has been an advocate for neighbors and neighborhoods across Phoenix and especially in Arcadia for more than 40 years.

AONA residents may also know Paul from St. Theresa's Parish, where he serves as an usher. He also values serving with his fellow parishioners on St. Theresa's chapter of St. Vincent de Paul, providing direct temporary assistance to people in need in our area.

Perhaps the most significant thing Paul has contributed over the years has been his mentorship of countless citizens seeking to understand the process and effects of urban planning on neighborhoods and our quality of life.

Former Arizona Attorney General and Phoenix Mayor Terry Goddard called Paul "The Lion of Arcadia." We agree. Many of us have heard Paul's roar at public hearings, yet his gracious nature belies that fact. As an honorary member of the AONA Board, Paul continues his active service and support of our cause.

With water allocations from the Colorado River being reduced and declining levels at Lake Powell and Lake Mead, here are a few tips on ways to conserve your residential water usage.
