Visit an Arcadia Little Library

In the past three months we have all had to adjust to being home and disconnected from the world.

During these times we have picked up new hobbies, learned to cook,

and grown closer to our families. Arcadians have come together, while social distancing, to protect our neighbors and our loved ones.



The past months we have seen an outpouring of love and shared responsibility. These little libraries are the pulse of the neighborhood; they provide comfort to those seeking an escape.

Summer Safety Tips

This summer may be different than others in recent memory. Still, take steps to protect your home with these tips:

- Before you leave: Have good locks on all doors and windows, and USE THEM!
- Ask a neighbor to watch the house while you're away. Leave your vacation contact info with family or a neighbor so you can be reached in case of an emergency.
- **Never** leave your house keys hidden outside your home.
- **Stop all deliveries,** or arrange for a neighbor to pick up your mail, newspapers and packages.
- Arrange for someone to mow your lawn & maintain the yard to give the home a lived-in look.
- Plug in timers to turn lights and a radio or television on and off at appropriate times. This helps to disguise that you are away.
- If you have a landline, turn the bell or ringer on your telephone down low. If a burglar is around, he won't be alerted to your absence by a ringing phone.
- **Don't announce** your absence on voice mail or social media.
- Leave blinds, shades and curtains in a normal position. Don't close them unless that is what you do when you are home.
- Close and lock garage doors and windows. Ask a neighbor to occasionally park their car at your home as you normally would.
- **Secure** storage sheds, attic entrances and gates.
- Let your neighbors know to call the police for suspicious activity. They should call 911 and let the officers check it out.
