History of the Arcadia Osborn Neighborhood Association

The Arcadia Osborn Neighborhood Association was incorporated in 1997. Boundaries – from 40th. St. to 56th. Street; and from Indian School Rd. to Thomas Rd. Membership in the association is voluntary. There are no fees for being a member.




The Old Crosscut Canal was built in 1888. It ran parallel to what is now 48th Street. The canal was an irrigation ditch that provided water to citrus orchards, and other farms. It was replaced in 1912 by the New Crosscut Canal that runs along 64th. St. That canal provides both irrigation water and hydro-electric power. When it opened, the Old Crosscut Canal became a flood prevention ditch to carry rainwater out of neighborhoods from Camelback Mountain and south, all the way to the Salt River.

The association was formed as a result of neighbors coming together to oppose the extension of the 143 Freeway north up 48th. St. from

McDowell Rd. to Indian School Rd. Those neighbors convinced the City of Phoenix and the Army Corp of Engineers to end the proposed freeway ay McDowell, rather than cut the south end of the Arcadia community in half. The City's plan was to run the old canal through a pipe under the new freeway.

The Old Crosscut Canal is now buried beneath the park we all know today as the Old Crosscut Canal Park that parallels 48th. Street from Indian School Rd. to McDowell Rd. Thanks to the Arcadia Osborn Neighborhood Association founders, the area was not bisected by a six-lane freeway. Today, neighbors enjoy a beautiful park that is an asset for everyone.





Attend the Design meeting to be held on Wednesday September 26th. at 7 PM in the auditorium at Veritas School

Over the past few years 56th St has moved from a quiet local street to a major collector roadway that thousands of vehicles are using daily as a pass-through on their way to & from the 202 Fwy, the 143 Fwy, downtown Phoenix, Scottsdale, the Airport, & other locations. Neighbors who live on 56th St or on intersecting streets are finding it more & more difficult to get in & out of their local streets, or to cross or merge onto 56th St. In 2017, AONA joined forces with our neighbors, the Arcadia Camelback Mountain Neighborhood Association (ACMNA), & applied for a Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG) Grant to begin a study of ways to moderate speed, reduce the volume of traffic on 56th St & make it much safer for school children, pedestrians, bicycles, & others who are traveling between Camelback Rd & Thomas Rd on 56th St.

The first two community outreach meetings were held at the Prince of Peace Church, & at Veritas School. During the first meeting, the consultants reviewed the scope of the project, discussed known issues, gave examples of solutions, & collected feedback. The final meeting will be held at Veritas School at 7 PM on Wednesday, September 26th. It will be followed by recommendations that will be sent to the Streets Department & the City Council for approval & financing of a "Complete Streets" upgrade of 56th St. Come out to participate in & learn what will happen & how you can provide input on the design.
