On January 17, 2020, the staff of Hospice of the Valley, neighbors, friends, Mayor Gallego, Councilman DiCiccio, members of the AONA Board, and others gathered on the lot at the corner of 44th. St. and Indianola Ave. (the old headquarters for SUSD) to celebrate the groundbreaking of the Hospice of the Valley Dementia Care and Education Center. This

asset to our community will bring services for families who have loved ones and individuals who are struggling with dementia. HOV president Debbie Shumway said "the neighborhood has been great to work with" and that AONA "helped make the project stronger." Working alongside HOV were zoning attorneys Paul Gilbert and Dennis Newcombe of Beus Gilbert; AONA Board Members Neal Haddad, Crystal DeVelis, and Wally Graham; and many neighbors who attended meetings to assure fit the character of our neighborhood. The center is scheduled for completion in 2021.


